

# **DIVING EMERGENCY GUIDELINE**

## FIRST AID FOR DIVING ACCIDENTS





- > If DCI symptoms appear rapidly, lay diver flat.
- > If diver is unconscious but breathing normally, place in recovery position.
- > If there are no neurological signs or symptoms, manage diver in a position of comfort.
